

Corton Primary School and Nursery Report for 2024/25

At Corton Primary School and Nursery, the pupils access a wide range of activities. This can include talks with visiting speakers, school outings, various clubs during and after school to encourage their interests, and support for Year 6 children transferring to their chosen high school.

The commitment of the staff towards the children is exemplary and this is reflected in the success of the school. They work extremely hard supporting the children in all aspects of their education, well-being and care.

Termly Activities

Summer Term 2024 – Summer is always a very busy term with children sitting the SATs tests in Year 2 and Year 6, teachers preparing the end of year reports for parents and the Annual Sports Day. In addition, a dance festival, the popular Corton's Got Talent, and two music concerts were also held.

The children went out of school to visit various venues which included the older children going to Eaton Vale Activity Centre, Year 3/4 visiting the School Farm & Country Fayre in Ipswich, Year 1/2 went to the Time and Tide Museum in Great Yarmouth and Nursery/Reception went to Pettit's Animal Adventure Park.

Autumn Term 2024 - Friends of Corton School arranged a disco for the children.

The Flu Vaccine was offered to all the children.

On 10th December, the whole school went to the Hippodrome Circus Christmas Spectacular in Great Yarmouth. Other Christmas events included Festive Workshops, a Chistingle Service, a Rock Steady Concert, KS2 Music Concert, School Discos, a Christmas Jumper Day, and a Christmas Carol Concert held on the school playground.

Year 6 pupils attended a 'Crucial Crew' event, where they took part in several interactive and eye-opening sessions delivered by professionals. These included fire-safety, road and cycling safety, alcohol and drug awareness, anti-social behaviour awareness, staying safe online and the use of mobile devices.

Spring Term 2025 - The Cost of a school lunch increased to £2.90.

Our Early Years children were very lucky to receive a visit from the Lowestoft South Fire Fighters. During the afternoon, the children listened to key safety messages from the firefighters, they looked around the fire engine and used a fire hose. The children loved seeing how far the water sprayed from the hose!

World Book Day was held on 7th March and children dressed up as their favourite Super-heros.

The children took part in Red Nose Day, dressing in red and raising money by buying cakes at the Cake Sale.

Corton Theatre Club performed at the Bethel Theatre in Lowestoft on Wednesday 26th March.

Online Safety – Workshops about staying safe online were delivered to all children, staff, parents and Governors.

Every week, the school celebrates the achievement of individuals from each class and there is also a Good Citizens award for children based on various themes. This term the theme was Wisdom.
